Wild Turkey Hunting Seminar

The DFW in partnership with the NJ Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation (NJNIWTF) will be hosting a **Wild Turkey Hunting Seminar** on Saturday, March 31 at Batsto Village in Wharton State Forest in Burlington County. The seminar will begin at 10:00 a.m. and run until approximately 1:00 pm. Admission to this seminar is free of charge. Participants of all ages and turkey hunting skill levels are encouraged to attend.

The seminar will be conducted by
Lou Gambale, NJNIWTF President and Save the Habitat/Save the Hunt Coordinator.

This seminar will blanket a range of topics from before the hunt to after the shot. This includes hunting site selection and scouting tips, turkey feeding habitats and food sources, equipment selection, calling tactics, and field processing. Participants are encouraged to bring their personal calls for a turkey-calling clinic following the seminar. Lou will be demonstrating with a variety of calls and allow participants to try their turkey calling skills with a variety of box, slate, and air-operated calls.
